Collaborative Digital Wall

What is it?

A collaborative digital wall is a tool that allows the learner to easily share and regroup various contents such as texts, videos, pictures, pdfs, or web links in a single, one-page, virtual wall.

Why do it?

Useful to collect and organize ideas in brainstorming sessions, centralize educational content to be accessed at any time, collect productions made by learners, or even create an open space for communication and collaboration. Highly customizable, a collaborative digital wall can be adapted to suit multiple learning goals.

When to use it?

Anytime during a session: as an ice breaker at the beginning of training, after a lecture for brainstorming, etc.

How to do it?

Required Materials

Different tools allow you to create collaborative digital walls, such as Digipad, an app preinstalled on the Beekee Box/Hub.

> Steps

- 1. Define the purpose of your wall: To which learning goal does it answer?
- 2. Create a wall on Digipad.
- 3. Change the settings according to your session needs (e.g. if you want learners to be able to comment on a post, activate the option) and select the best format for your goal.
- 4. Pre-populate contents to your wall.
- 5. Give learners access to the wall.



Peers' collaboration for understanding reading materials remotely

Context

A digital collaborative wall was used in a woodworking blended/hybrid class. During the remote session, learners are asked to read and get familiar to some learning materials. For this, the teacher embedded the documents on a digital wall and shared them with the learners. They could directly read the documents on the wall and in case of doubts, they could ask questions in the comments section.

Tools

Digipad was used for this activity. The teacher activated the comments on the settings and chose "Wall" as a display.

Why do it?

To centralize readings and give learners the opportunity to comment on them in one place. If they have difficulties in understanding the material, they can ask easily for help from their peers. Other learners might also find the answers to their questions in the comment session. Also, studies show that explaining a concept contributes to learning.
